The San Francisco Chronicle, the largest newspaper in Northern California and the second largest on the West Coast, opposes Prop 24, real estate mogul Alastair Mactaggart's flawed pay-for-privacy initiative

SAN FRANCISCO – The San Francisco Chronicle editorial board recommends NO on Proposition 24, the flawed and deceptive 52-page measure on the November ballot. The San Francisco Chronicle is the largest newspaper in Northern California and the second largest on the West Coast.

The [editorial states](#): “There are no advancements to law in this initiative that could not be enacted by the California Legislature, after public hearings and vetting to assure they actually achieve their intended purpose and the ability to course correct for unintended consequences that emerge.” The editorial goes on to say, “There is sufficient doubt about Prop. 24 to make the decision clear. Vote no.”

The San Francisco Chronicle joins a growing list of opposition including 17 other editorial boards and dozens of consumer, privacy, social justice, and small business advocates opposing Proposition 24 including Color of Change, Center for Digital Democracy, ACLU of California, Consumer Federation of California, Californians For Privacy Now, labor icon Dolores Huerta, Council on American-Islamic Relations, California Alliance for Retired Americans, the California Small Business Association, the Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce, the California Nurses Association, and the League of Women Voters.

Proposition 24 weakens California's 2018 landmark privacy law, creates a toothless new state privacy bureaucracy, and will cost California consumers and small businesses billions.
